Operational information

HANDICAP RATINGS

Just prior to the commencement of our tournament all player handicap indices are extracted from the handicaps database. Your handicap index is fixed for the duration of the tournament. Depending on the course, the tee positions and the competition being played your handicap index is converted into your course handicap. This course handicap will be shown on your score card which you will receive on your starting tee.

THE DRAW

In making the draw preference has been given to ensuring players have two rounds on each course, do not play with players from their own society except during the Pinehurst, and do not play with the same player more than once. In addition where possible, tee times have been arranged to try and assist players with similar travel arrangements and a variety of other requests. If all requests cannot be fulfilled, the Tournament Director apologizes to anyone who may be inconvenienced.

ONE SET OF TEES

The tournament will be played from a single set of tees. Please report to the Starter on the tee at least 10 minutes before your tee-off time.

CLASS COMPETITIONS

Class groupings have been established to ensure fair competition among players of similar age. Winners and runners-up of Class E will receive the Methuselah cup and trophy, reserved for members older than 75 at the registration date. For other players, an algorithm will distribute them into 4 classes (A to D) based on age. Class allocations will be communicated in your welcome letter.

SCORE CARDS

Score cards and local rules will be provided by the Starters at the tee of the course you are playing. Complete and submit your scorecard immediately upon completing your round. Your daily score card will include your competition handicap that is derived from your handicap index extracted from the handicaps database just prior to the tournament.

SLOW PLAY

To maintain a reasonable pace of play, please:

- **Speed up your own play and that of your partners.**
- **Pick up if you cannot score or improve your partner's score.**
- **Ensure you keep up with the group ahead.**
- **Respect the requests of Course Marshals. Offenders may be penalized under Rule 5.6a.**
- **No practising is allowed on the course during play.**

TWO CLUBS

The entry fee for the two clubs has already been prepaid. You may claim your two clubs when submitting your scorecards to the official scorers for checking. Please note that no two clubs will be awarded for the Pinehurst competition.

PRIZES

Players may receive only one prize for individual events on any given day (excluding team events). In the event of a tie, the older or more senior players will be declared the winners.

Winners of the Monday and Tuesday competitions will receive their prizes at the end of the Annual Members Meeting on Tuesday, 30th March at Schoemanpark Golf Club golf in the main hall.

Presentation of prizes for the Championship and related events will be held during the Gala Dinner on the Thursday evening at Leopards & Lace: 9 Sterling Ave, Spitskop Bloemfontein.

DRESS CODE AFTER PLAY

Smart casual attire is recommended. Kindly wear your name badges after golf and at all social functions.

GOLF CARTS

Golf carts are available for players who requested them during entry submission. Golf Cart and caddie allocations are shown in your welcome letter.

Cart fees are R400 at both Clubs.

CADDIES

Bloemfontein Golf Club

It has been 10 years since the Seniors National Tournament was last held in Bloemfontein and for those seniors who played there in 2015 the decision to move the tournament one month earlier in the calendar will have been welcomed.

Bloemfontein in May, which was the traditional date, can be chilly in the mornings, with the possibility of frost. This year, competitors should enjoy the best course conditions at a summery time of year.

Bloemfontein Golf Club celebrated its 130th anniversary in 2024, and while not the oldest golf club in the Free State – that distinction belongs to Harrismith (1887) – it has long been regarded as the province's premier championship course. It has held two SA Opens, although the last of those was more than 60 years ago.

More recently, it hosted the Sunshine Tour's Mangaung Open in 2022, when there was a course record 61 by Jbe Kruger. The original Bob Grimsdell course was redesigned by Peter Matkovich in 1993, with all the greens re-shaped and modernised. The greens can be challenging, because they are both large and undulating surfaces.

The course itself is fairly wide open off the tee, and it certainly suited the long hitting abilities of the club's most famous member of recent times, Wilco Nienaber. He joined the club at age 13 in 2013, and quickly made an impact with the sensational distances he drove the ball. He won the 2018 Free State Open on his home course, and one of his longest drives was measured at 360 metres.

Bloemfontein Golf Club member Derek Lunt won the championship on the last two occasions it was held in his home city. He scored 157 in 2015, and 149 in 2008. Lunt claimed a third title at Royal Johannesburg in 2018.

The course is divided in two by a deep spruit that originates in the city centre, and forms a useful hazard on several holes, notably the par-5 14th where the river runs alongside the left side of the fairway from tee to green, and also at two of the par 3s, 8 and 11. The majority of holes shape right to left at Bloemfontein, notably two of the best long par 4s, the tree-lined ninth with its fairway bunkers, and 17 with its water hazards.

Another renowned long hitter who grew up in Bloemfontein was Dean Burmester, although he was a member at Schoemanpark. One of his early wins on the Sunshine Tour came in 2015 at BGC in the Sun Windmill Challenge where he shot 18-under for 54 holes.

Gary Player and Jack Nicklaus played an exhibition match in 1966. A dam left of the second hole was known as Nicklaus Hook after a stray drive he hit there. BGC keeps track of players having an albatross (3-under) and there have been 35 of them, including three by Mervyn Greenstein.

The club has an excellent range facility.

Schoemanpark Golf Club

Schoemanpark is an old-fashioned 1950s layout that has stayed much the same from when it was built to the present day. It is thought to be a Bob Grimsdell design. Only a professional course architect could have devised such an interesting and challenging layout.

It proved an excellent test for two generations of pro golfers from the 1970s through to the 1990s. Schoemanpark was home to 10 Sunshine Tour events during this era – five from 1970-74, and five from 1988-1992 – while Bloemfontein GC traditionally hosted the SA Golf Union championships.

Schoemanpark has long been associated with SA Railways, and Transnet own the land. Scotsmen working for the Railway Institute founded the club in 1904. There is a train carriage next to the first tee. When the club moved to its new course adjoining Bloemfontein GC, it was renamed after Ben Schoeman, South Africa's Minister of Transport from 1954-1974, who worked on steam trains as a driver and fireman.

The course has bags of character, its tree-lined holes continually changing direction, which can also be said of Bloemfontein next door. The front nine, at 3032 metres, is considerably shorter than the back, wherein lie nine exceedingly strong holes. The front nine is where you make your birdies – Mark McNulty birdied the first seven holes on his way to a 61 in the 1988 Bloemfontein Classic – because 10-18 is a question of hanging on to what you have. The par 4s are all difficult, and 17 is a 204-meter par 3.

The course still retains shallow concrete-lined ponds close to some greens, although the plan is to remove them to improve the aesthetics.

Both Schoemanpark and Bloemfontein GC have attractive single-storey clubhouses. Schoemanpark, in respect to tradition, have retained the look of their old 19th hole with its original wood panelling and bar counter.

Schoemanpark has been the home club of several Sunshine Tour champions, and their large images have often been displayed on the outside deck of the clubhouse. They include Ian Palmer, Jbe Kruger, Dean Burmester, Alex Haindl and Hendrik Buhrmann. Palmer was the club pro for more than 25 years before his retirement, and a club member for 54 years. He competed on the European Tour, winning the 1992 Johnnie Walker Classic and 1993 Jersey Open.

Ernie Els was the guest speaker at the club's centenary. His first tournament as a professional was the 1989 Bloemfontein Classic at Schoemanpark.

Management Committee Report

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

I am pleased, on behalf of MANCOM, to submit this report of our Union for the year ended 31 December 2024. In May our 83rd National Tournament was superbly hosted by the KwaZulu-Natal Society and September saw our touring party embark on a 14 day golf tour of Chile warmly hosted by our associated Seniors Society in Chile. By all accounts both events were immensely enjoyable and successful. As referred to below, a highly attractive tour to South Africa in March 2025 by the Senior Golfers Society of the United Kingdom was in turn superbly hosted by the Western Cape, KwaZulu Natal and Gauteng Societies. The touring party were lavish in their praises of tour arranged for them and of the hospitality of the host Societies. More about this tour will be included in next year's report.

Generally, the Union remains on a sound footing with a secure financial base and an effective tournament computer system which is continually being updated and refined. This year we look forward to again enjoying the hospitality of the Free State Society as they host the National Tournament in Bloemfontein and, as in the past, we look forward to enjoying the warm and friendly hospitality of our hosts for which they are well known. We are delighted to welcome to Bloemfontein a delegation from the Seniors' Golfers Society of Zambia and trust that they will thoroughly enjoy the Tournament.

Mancom remains mindful of the head winds facing the members of our Union particularly the aging and contracting membership faced by certain of our Societies, which is, to some extent, due to re-locations from up-country to coastal societies, and to the growing trend of green fees at the home clubs of members being paid on an annual or composite basis which adds to the cost of participating in matches at other clubs. In the light of these challenges and because it is, in any event, desirable to provide from time to time a platform for the discussion of matters

of interest or concern to Seniors, I will be proposing to the Annual General Meeting of our Governing Body that a Planning Meeting involving representatives of our various Societies, Mancom and the Governing Body be held later in the year.

FINANCIAL REPORT

We are pleased to report that your Union continues on a sound financial footing and a summary of the unaudited financial statements is attached for your information. Audited financial statements will be available to members of the Governing Body shortly.

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

The financial statements reflect a deficit for the year (before the revaluation of investments) of R25 047 versus the previous year's surplus of R91 619.

The KZN Society organised a very enjoyable 2024 National Tournament which reflects a small deficit of R27 773.

Income from investments comprising both interest and dividends amounted to R262 008 compared to R238 042 in 2023.

The level of administrative and operating expenditure was well-contained with an overall positive variance from budget.

The market value of our equities portfolio appreciated during the year. The fair value increased by R440 268 from the prior year (2023 – increased by R215 429).

The investment fair value reserve is currently stated at R1 304 179 (2023 – R863911).

Budget

A budget for the year ending 31 December 2025 is attached and reflects a proposed loss of R291 659 (2023 – loss R60 195). Consistent with prior years, this budgeted loss is stated before making provision for any development grants to societies and on the assumption that the National Tournament will achieve a break even position.

TOURS

During 2024 a group of 11 Seniors and 8 partners enjoyed a fantastic tour to Chile. The tour commenced on the 13th March and ended on the 28th March and was ably led by Rob Wassenaar as team captain.

The team was located in the capital Santiago for most of the tour but did spend a night in the country as guests of the Chilean Seniors. The top courses in the country were played on and the Chilean hosts entertained the South African in their normal superb manner.

The free days were well spent discovering the wonders of Chile.

At the end of the tour the South African team were declared winners and at the farewell dinner appropriate gifts and prized were handed over to the organisers and office bearers.

In 2025 we have been invited to send a team of 8 players to Paris to play in the Paris International Teams Championships for Seniors. This tournament has now replaced the annual Deauville Tournament that we used to support. The King Leopold tournament which was held in Belgium in the past and one which we supported has not been reinstated since Covid.

The 2026 venues

Humewood and Port Elizabeth Golf Club are the venues for the 2026 national tournament in Gqeberha. The last tournament held there was in 2016, and before that 2009 when Alistair Forbes posted a remarkable round of eight-under-par 64 on the Humewood links to win the championship for the first time on a record score of 136. He repeated that victory in 2016 for his sixth title.

Other past senior champions at these venues have been Ray White (2002), and Reg Taylor (1995 and 1989).

Humewood on the shores of Algoa Bay is considered by golfing purists as being the only true links in South Africa, and there is no debate about it being one of our greatest courses, designed from scratch by English course architect Colonel SV Hotchkin in the late 1920s and opened for play in 1931. It was originally part of PE Golf Club, a second course for members, and only in 1952 did it become a separate club.

PE Golf Club, in contrast to Humewood, is an old-fashioned parkland layout, and a testing one that, like Humewood, has been host to numerous South African championships over the years. Both clubs have held the SA Open, Humewood most recently in 2006.
