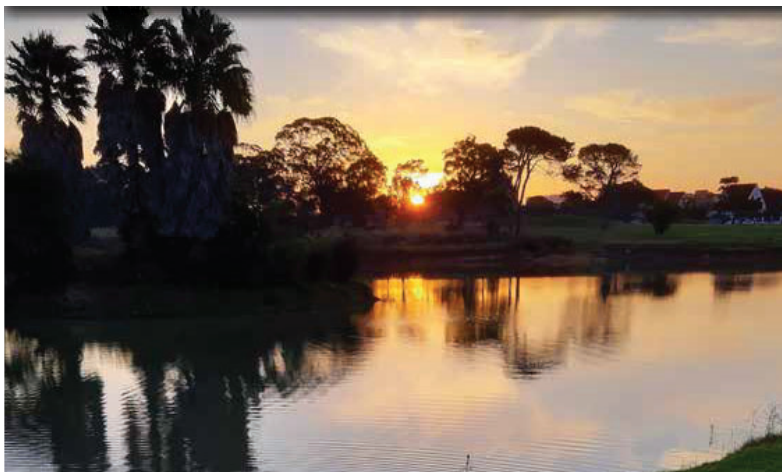

# Information - Golf

## PRACTICE ROUNDS - SUNDAY 15TH MAY

Practice rounds are available on both courses and you are requested to make your own arrangements by booking directly at East London Golf Club, Glen Eagles Road, Bunkers Hill, Tel 043 735 1357 and the West Bank Golf Club, Hood Street, West Bank Tel 043 731 1523 and identifying yourself as a Senior.

## PRIZES

- No player may receive more than the one prize for events, excluding team events, on any one day. Should a tie occur in any of the events, including the Championship, those senior in age, or in combined ages, shall be the winners.
- Winners of the Monday and Tuesday competitions will receive their prizes at the end of the Annual Members Meeting on Tuesday, 17th MAY at the East London Golf Club.
- Presentation of prizes for the Championship and related events will be held during the Gala Dinner on the Thursday evening.

## TWO CLUBS

The entry fee for the two clubs has been pre-paid. Two clubs are claimed and paid to you when handing your score cards to the official scorers for checking.

## SCORE CARDS

Score cards and any local rules will be issued to you by the Starters on the tee at whichever course you are playing. Please complete and hand in your card immediately on completion of your round.

## SLOW PLAY

Please assist in eliminating slow play by:

- Speeding up your own play and that of your playing partners.
- Picking up in Stableford competition, if you are not able to score or improve your partner's score.
- Making sure you keep up with the group in front.
- Course Marshalls will be in attendance throughout the tournament. Please respect their requests. Offenders may be penalized under Rule 5.6a.

## ONE SET OF TEES

The Tournament will be played off one set of tees. Players must enter their score 15 minutes after completion of round.

Please report to the Starter on the tee at least 10 minutes before your tee off time.

## CATERING

Breakfast and light refreshments are available from 07h00 at both East London and West Bank Golf Clubs.

## CHAMPIONSHIP PLAY

On Wednesday and Thursday competitors with a handicap index of 7.5 or less will compete for the Championship proper on a Stroke Play basis (Gross only), as well as competing in the Stableford competitions which will be contested by all other players.

## CLASS COMPETITIONS

After examining the distribution of the ages of players who participated in the last four national tournaments it was obvious that the numbers of players in each class were significantly skewed to the older age classes.

The purpose of the class groupings is for tournament players to compete against others of a similar age for the class prizes. It was also necessary to have similar numbers of players in each class.

Because the winner and runner up of Class E are awarded the Methuselah cup and trophy at the prize giving function, it was decided to preserve this Class for those members who are older than 75 at the registration date.





# Information - Golf

For the remainder of the players an algorithm has been designed to distribute the players into 4 classes (A to D) in approximately even numbers using whole completed years at the registration date of the tournament.

Players will be informed of their class allocations at registration. The class will be included in the welcome letter that players will receive at registration.

## PRACTICE AREAS

The East London Golf Club has practice facilities for chipping and putting and West Bank Golf Club has practice facilities for putting.

## CADDIES

Caddie fees are R250 plus R30 halfway for both courses.

## GOLF CARTS

- Golf carts have been arranged for all those players who requested them when submitting their entry application. A list of golf cart allocations, which may or may not provide for sharing, will be displayed at Registration.
- Players in the 'A' or Championship Division must produce a valid medical certificate.
- The carts will be issued by the Pro Shop staff at East London and West Bank Golf Clubs at a fee of R300 per cart.
  - Players requiring golf carts on Sunday should make their own arrangements with the respective clubs.

## HALFWAY HOUSE

To assist speeding up the completion of rounds, a limited halfway house menu will be available. A R50 voucher will be issued for each round - non refundable.

## PLAYING FEES

- No playing fees will be payable during the four days of the Tournament.
- Playing fees have been prepaid for the entire tournament including the Sunday mixed competition.
- Special rates are available for the Sunday practice rounds. Contact the relevant club for bookings.

## HANDICAP RATINGS

Your official handicap index for the four days of golf is that which is valid on 14th May 2022 before start of play. Please confirm your handicap index when you register for the tournament. The maximum handicap index is as issued by the South African Golf Association (SAGA). If your handicap index has changed and moved you into or out of the Championship Division after the submission and acceptance of your entry, please advise Vaughan Sammons on cell number 083 253 5414 or e-mail [sgusa@mwebbiz.co.za](mailto:sgusa@mwebbiz.co.za) as the draw could be affected.

## DRAW

In making the draw preference has been given to ensuring players have two rounds on each course, do not play with players from their own province except during the Pinehurst, and do not play with the same player more than once. In addition where possible, rounds have been arranged to try and assist players with similar travel arrangements and a variety of other requests. If all requests are not met, the Tournament Director apologises to anyone that might be inconvenienced.

## MIXED GOLF COMPETITION - SUNDAY, 15th MAY

This competition for Senior Golfers and their lady partners is being played on the East London Golf Course. The format is a Four Ball Alliance with 2 scores to count, teeing off from 10h00. If you have entered for the Mixed Golf without a partner, the Tournament Organising Committee will endeavor to find you a lady partner and her green fee will be for your account.

# East London Golf Club



Founded in 1893, the East London Golf Club is one of the oldest golf clubs in South Africa. The current course, constructed in 1923 comprises a traditional course layout, set amongst hills, dunes and coastal indigenous bush. The course borrows elements from both parklands and links formats and has combined them skilfully into the championship course that exists today. East London Golf Club is consistently in Golf Digest's Top 20 courses and has retained - over the years - a position of high recognition as one of the best Championship courses in South Africa. Selected to host six South African Opens and being a regular host to National and Regional Championships confirms the regard with which the club is held. East London first hosted the Africa Open in 2009. In 2010 the Africa Open became part of the European Tour, until 2015 when the sponsorship was discontinued.

The large clubhouse and facilities, set high above the eighteenth hole, with spectacular views of the course, are well equipped for functions and catering.

The course offers up some breath-taking views of the Indian Ocean and notably, Nahoon Reef, a world famous surf break. Playing the East London golf course, the golf challenges vary daily, subject to the directions of prevailing winds. The signature dog leg par four twelfth, one of the countries premiere holes, takes you on a journey from an elevated tee through a valley lined on the left by indigenous bush, to a large raised green with spectacular views of the rocky shore and ocean. The course also brims with wildlife and is home to the knysna (lourie) turaco, as well as a variety of other birdlife, ensuring an excellent all round experience.





# West Bank Golf Club



Only a stone's throw or well hit drive from the Indian Ocean, south of East London's Buffalo River stands the well-established championship golf course of the West Bank Golf Club. Founded in 1907, and constructed around the iconic Hood Point lighthouse (1895), West Bank is also one of the country's oldest and most distinctive golf clubs and is renowned for its relaxed atmosphere of convivial good fellowship. West Bank takes tremendous pride in its heritage and once again is honoured to be hosting the Senior Golfers Union of South Africa's National Tournament.

West Bank Golf Club affords golfers impressive views of the rocky shoreline, pristine beaches and beautiful seascapes. The clubhouse commands impressive views of the course and the Indian Ocean and the course has a unique feature in that golfers can see the sea from every tee.

Hopefully the weather will be good for the tournament as the course transforms from a benign pleasure to an extreme challenge of golfing skill and course management when played under harsh weather conditions. Each of the 18-holes has its own unique challenges and depending on wind direction, an ability to test the skill of even the most accomplished golfer. Golfers will find the par threes challenging especially if the notorious prevailing east wind blows.

# Past Presidents & Champions

In May 1935 the first Society, the Senior Golfers' Society of the Transvaal was formed with WF Barker as the first President. In 1937 they, together with four more societies formed the Senior Golfers' Union of South Africa.

The first National Tournament was held in East London in 1938 and has been played every year except 2020 and 2021. The first Champion was John Dock with a score of 85. The Championship Urn was donated by Captain Carlton Levick CBE, a very senior golfer from the UK. In 1942 the format was changed to 36 holes. # *Management Committee Report*

## *for the Years ended December 2020 and 2021*

The last two years have been very testing, not only for life in general and the economy, but also for Senior golf. We have been fortunate in that we have been able to play some golf but the disruption to our normal social activities as a result of government restrictions has been great and we have had to modify and curtail the way we do things. We very much look forward to being able to resume our traditional interactions and look forward to a speedy return to normal.

After being unable to stage a National Tournament for two years we are delighted to be able to gather here in East London for what is sure to be a wonderful week. We are also extremely grateful to the Border Tournament Organising Committee for the way they have taken the set-backs occasioned by the pandemic in their stride and have put together a great programme for us.

We are once again privileged to be able to welcome as guests a number of Seniors from The Senior Golfers' Society of Zambia. At times Southern Africa feels a long way from the rest of the golfing world and their attendance here with us certainly adds to the occasion and brings with it a welcome international flavour.

Following the SGUSA AGM last year the national membership quota was reduced to 920 and at the end of 2021 the total membership of Seniors countrywide stood at 855 which is 65 under quota.

It is extremely positive that a number of Societies have made significant progress in expanding the diversity of our membership and it is important that we all strive to continue the good work to position Seniors to better reflect the evolving golfing society in our country.

### FINANCIAL REPORT

#### Financial highlights

The financial statements reflect a deficit (before the revaluation of investments) of R41 728 for the year versus the previous year's deficit of R246 375.

Income from investments comprising both interest and dividends amounted to R151 416 (2020 R150 805). However, there were no major variances from our operating budget during the year and the level of administration and operating expenses was well contained.

A copy of the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2021 is available on request.

#### Investment Portfolio.

As reported last year our investment portfolio was repositioned and now consists exclusively of bank preference shares and holdings in exchange-traded funds. In March 2021, a further R810 815 of bank preference shares was acquired. This has proved a sound strategy and the market value of our portfolio increased by R716 388 year on year (2020-decrease in value R237 541).

#### Transfer to Reserves

No claims were made against our specific reserves during the year and no transfers have been proposed .

#### Budget

A budget for the year ending 31 December 2022 is attached and reflects a deficit of R 59 411 (2021 -surplus R 16 983).





## TOURS

As a result of the Covid pandemic which has engulfed the world there have been severe restrictions on international recreational travel since March 2020 and no international Seniors tours have taken place. 2022 promises a return to some level of normality with a tour of 12 Seniors, accompanied by their partners, to the east coast of Australia planned for October 2022. In addition we have received invitations to send teams to the King Leopold Challenge played in Belgium from 4th to 7th July as well as the Senior Golfer Association of Europe Championship to be held in France in August.

## IT

No significant upgrades to our Tournament System were introduced during the year. Some minor upgrades are anticipated to accommodate changes introduced by SAGA to the handicapping regime.

## NATIONAL TOURNAMENT

Two eventful years have passed with no National Tournament taking place, much to the disappointment of many of our members, and the continuing threat posed by Covid is still with us. Absence makes the avid golfer more keen and the Border Society must be congratulated on their enthusiasm and determination to present a memorable and enjoyable 2022 Tournament.

After canvassing the Governing Body and taking cognisance of the stance of other sports bodies it was decided that all participants in the 2022 Tournament, as well as their participating partners, will be required to be fully vaccinated. The average age of competitors has risen over the years and we believe this approach is essential in the interests of all participating members.

The two course, one field, format recently adopted has made it possible to move the event to May for the foreseeable future, thus avoiding the scheduling difficulties of a holiday filled April as well as clashing with events organised by other golfing societies.

We hope that next year's report will be filled with a glowing account of a successful and highly enjoyable 2022 Tournament.

## CONCLUSION

The last two years have been extremely difficult for all of us and not since World War II have our activities been so disrupted. I would once again like to express my deepest thanks to the members of Mancom for their invaluable contribution and unstinting support over the last year. A word of thanks also to Haydn Thomson who has, for an unprecedented three years, joined us on Mancom as President of the Union. His support and counsel have been very much appreciated.

As always a special word of thanks is due to our Secretary, Frank Rosslee. He has managed the added complications resulting from the pandemic with aplomb and his contribution to the smooth running of your Union and of the Tournament has been indispensable and is much appreciated.
