PRIZES

- No player may receive more than the one prize for events, excluding team events, on any one day. Should a tie occur in any of the events, including the Championship, those senior in age, or in combined ages, shall be the winners.
- Winners of the Monday and Tuesday competitions will receive their prizes at the end of the Annual Members Meeting on Tuesday, 9th May at the Pretoria Country Club Grand Lounge.
- Presentation of prizes for the Championship and related events will be held during the Gala Dinner on the Thursday evening.

TWO CLUBS

The entry fee for the two clubs has been pre-paid. Two clubs are claimed and paid to you when handing your score cards to the official scorers for checking. No 2 clubs for Pinehurst will be awarded.

SCORE CARDS

Score cards and any local rules will be issued to you by the Starters on the tee at whichever course you are playing. Please complete and hand in your card immediately on completion of your round.

SLOW PLAY

- Please assist in eliminating slow play by:
- Speeding up your own play and that of your playing partners.
- Picking up, if you are not able to score or improve your partner's score.
- Making sure you keep up with the group in front.
- Course Marshalls will be in attendance throughout the tournament. Please respect their requests. Offenders may be penalized under Rule 5.6a.
- No practising on the Course during play.

ONE SET OF TEES

The Tournament will be played off one set of tees. Players must submit their score immediately after completion of round.

Please report to the Starter on the tee at least 10 minutes before your tee off time.

CATERING

Breakfast and light refreshments are available from 07h00 at both Courses.

CHAMPIONSHIP PLAY

On Wednesday and Thursday competitors with a handicap of 8 or less will compete for the Championship proper on a Stroke Play basis (Gross only), as well as competing in the Stableford competitions which will be contested by all other players.

CLASS COMPETITIONS

After examining the distribution of the ages of players who participated in the last four national tournaments it was obvious that the numbers of players in each class were significantly skewed to the older age classes.

The purpose of the class groupings is for tournament players to compete against others of a similar age for the class prizes. It was also necessary to have similar numbers of players in each class. Because the winner and runner up of Class E are awarded the Methuselah cup and trophy at the prize giving function, it was decided to preserve this Class for those members who are older than 75 at the registration date.

For the remainder of the players an algorithm has been designed to distribute the players into 4 classes (A to D) in approximately even numbers using whole completed years at the registration date of the tournament.



Information - Golf

Players will be informed of their class allocations at registration. The class will be included in the welcome letter that players will receive at registration.

PRACTICE AREAS

Both Courses have practice facilities. Driving ranges will be open fron 07h30.

CADDIES

Caddie fees are R350 at Pretoria Country Club and R265 at Waterkloof Golf Course. All inclusive of Halfway vouchers.

GOLF CARTS

- Golf carts have been arranged for all those players who requested them when submitting their entry application. A list of golf cart allocations, which may or may not provide for sharing, will be displayed at Registration.
- The carts will be issued by the Pro Shop staff at a fee of R350 per cart at Pretoria Country Club and R280 at Waterkloof Golf Course.
- Players requiring golf carts on Sunday should make their own arrangements with the respective clubs.

HALFWAY HOUSE

To assist speeding up the completion of rounds, a limited halfway house menu will be available. A R70 voucher will be issued for each round - non refundable. Additional cost for own account.

PLAYING FEES

- No playing fees will be payable during the four days of the Tournament.
- Playing fees have been prepaid for the entire tournament including the Sunday mixed competition.
- Special rates are available for the Sunday practice rounds. Contact the relevant club for bookings.

HANDICAP RATINGS

Your official handicap for the four days of golf is that which is valid on 7th May 2023 before the start of play. Please confirm your handicap index when you register for the tournament. The maximum handicap index is as issued by the Handicap Network Africa. If your handicap index has changed and moved you into or out of the Championship Division after the submission and acceptance of you entry, please advise Vaughan Sammons on cell number 083 253 5414.

DRAW

In making the draw preference has been given to ensuring players have two rounds on each course, do not play with players from their own province except during the Pinehurst, and do not play with the same player more than once. In addition where possible, rounds have been arranged to try and assist players with similar travel arrangements and a variety of other requests. If all requests are not met, the Tournament Director apologises to anyone that might be inconvenienced.

MIXED GOLF COMPETITION - SUNDAY, 7th MAY

This competition for Senior Golfers and their lady partners is being played on the Pretoria Country Club Course. The format is a Four Ball Alliance with 2 scores to count, teeing off from 10h00.



Pretoria Country Club



Established in 1910 by mining magnate and property developer, Julius Jeppe, Pretoria Country Club is renowned for being the quality sports and social venue in Pretoria, set in the magnificent surroundings of the suburb of Waterkloof. It boasts a par 72 golf course, with a parklands layout and a rating of 72. In addition to golf the club enjoys excellent bowls, tennis, squash, snooker and fishing facilities in addition to excellent restaurant and lounge facilities in its pavilion. The prestigious Pretoria Club, founded in 1885 and previously situated in the city centre, has since 1998 been resident at Pretoria Country Club main building.

The 18-hole parkland course was extensively renovated by Gary Player and his design company in 2004 resulting in the upgrading of a number of features on the course, including new raised greens, water hazards and tree plantations. The most pronounced change to the course in 2004 was the introduction of no fewer than 95 deep pot bunkers around the course which significantly increased the difficulty of the course. In recent years however, some of these bunkers were removed but all remaining have been softened, making them less penal for member play.

The course is a mature parkland course with many small ponds dictating the flow and design of the holes. Greenkeeping is of the highest quality and greens, fairways, bunkers are kept at the very highest level of manicuring and water features are beautifully fitted into the course.

There are many great holes. Not extremely difficult to play but the subtle doglegs, bunkers and water hazards combine in a manner so as to make it not too easy for you, no matter which tee you play from.

The layout of the back nine is more undulating than the front nine and is well known for the tough stretch of five holes between 13 and 17 where water comes into play on each hole. The 18th is also a stern test, played uphill towards the home green with fourteen bunkers between the tee and the final putting surface.

The Pretoria Country Club hosted the Tshwane Open between 2015 and 2018

Waterkloof Golf Club



Waterkloof Golf Club sits in an attractive countryside setting on the south western flank of the Waterkloof Ridge, overlooking the R21 highway and the Groenkloof Nature Reserve. The Voortrekker Monument is nearby and can be seen from most parts of the course.

The club was founded in 1969 as Monument Golf Club, and following conversion of the property into a residential estate, beginning in 2004 it was renamed to Waterkloof Golf Club. At the same time the original layout was redesigned by Peter Matkovich.

Matkovich constructed some undulating greens complexes which provide the main challenge of a golf course that is relatively wide open off the tee. The par 3s are a feature, with the sixth measuring 206 metres from the back tees, while the 17th is 210 metres with a water hazard left of the green. The 15th is a beautifully framed par 3 of 183 metres.

The ninth and 18th greens come together up a gentle incline in front of the large double-storey clubhouse, both protected by the same large water hazard, the ninth being stroke 1 on the scorecard, a 443-metre par 4, while 18 is the shortest of the par 5s at 469 metres.

The estate homes are situated away from the golf course on the back nine. The course is popular with visitors, and 49 000 rounds were played at Waterkloof in 2021. The club offers affordable green fees, particularly for students and pensioners on weekday mornings. There are discounts for large groups on Sundays.
























Gauteng North Npdate

The Gauteng North Society is proud to have been given the opportunity to host a National Tournament in 2023 for the first time and is looking forward to creating a memorable atmosphere for this prestigious golfing event. Since its inception in late 2008 membership of the Gauteng North Senior Golfer's Society has steadily increased from an original 27 founding members to the current 82 (Quota 92).

The Society's members play twice a month, once at its home course Pretoria Country Club and at another Pretoria club on a rotational basis. Thus, approximately 20 games are played each year in addition to the National Tournament and other inter-provincial events. Included in the 20 games is the 'Across the Border" event in which teams from Gauteng North and Gauteng vie bi-annually for a trophy which periodically migrates across the 'boerewors curtain" at the Jukskei River between Pretoria and Johannesburg. Gauteng North is the current holder.

Under the leadership of its first President Corné Kruger, Gauteng North first participated in a national Tournament at Port Elizabeth in 2009 and, since then, despite its short history, members and teams from Gauteng North have won a number of honours at senior national and international tournaments.

- Wim Fourie won the Senior Golfers National trophy in 2017 at the National Tournament in Cape Town
- The Gauteng North team won the team prize for highest stableford points at four National Tournaments from 2009 to 2013 and in 2019 (Port Elizabeth, Cape Town, Johannesburg and East London, George)
- Johan Coetzee (2009) and Jan van der Merwe (2018) are both past winners of the Leslie Satchwell Trophy
- 2019 Bjorn Schildt won the individual stableford competition
- 2019 Jacot Jacot-Guillarmod won the Methuselah trophy
- 2019 Wim Fourie won the Class B individual competition
- In 2018 John Loftus won the Class A gross stableford competition
- In 2015, Bjorn Schildt and Freek Steyn were part of the South African Senior Golfers' team that won the World Senior Golf Championships in California USA
- In 2016 Joachim Mennen was a member of the South African Senior Golfer's team that won the 60th Deauville International Meeting in France.

Past Presidents 3 Champions

In May 1935 the first Society, the Senior Golfers' Society of the Transvaal was formed with WF Barker as the first President. In 1937 they, together with four more societies formed the Senior Golfers' Union of South Africa.

The first National Tournament was held in East London in 1938 and has been played every year except 2020 and 2021. The first Champion was John Dock with a score of 85. The Championship Urn was donated by Captain Carlton Levick CBE, a very senior golfer from the UK. In 1942 the format was changed to 36 holes. Management Committee Report for the Year ended 31 December 2022

We have now completed a full year of relative normalcy following the COVID 19 pandemic though some habits developed during the pandemic linger on. The forced relaxation of the dress code during the Covid years has prompted several societies to seek to continue this relaxation and are in the process of adopting policies that require jackets and ties to be obligatory only on Trophy Days and, in some cases, for away games. This year was also noteworthy in that Mancom convened and hosted in Johannesburg a Strategy Meeting to which the Union Office Bearers and the Presidents and Captains of all the Societies were invited. Much benefit was derived by Mancom and the Societies represented there from the discussions and exchanges which focused on overcoming the challenges facing our Seniors' movement including the falling and aging membership in some Societies, the diminishing participation in our National Tournament and the lack of diversity. The success of the meeting has prompted Mancom to resolve to convene and host such meetings more regularly.

FINANCIAL REPORT

We are pleased to report that your Union continues on a sound financial footing and a summary of the audited financial statements is attached for your information. The audited financial statements have been distributed to the members of the Governing Body.

Financial Highlights

The financial statements again reflect an acceptable situation for the Union despite showing a small loss (before the revaluation of investments) of R31 953 for the year versus the previous year's loss of R41 728. Congratulations are due to the Border Society for achieving a surplus of R24 178 in hosting the 2022 National tournament.

Income from investments comprising both interest and dividends amounted to R187 830 versus R151 416 in 2021. There were no major variances from our operating budget during the year and the level of administration expenses was well contained. However, a Strategy planning meeting was held in October for which unbudgeted costs of R85 921 were incurred.

The market value of our equities portfolio fell during the year largely in line with the J.S.E. The fair value decreased by R78 055 (2021 - increase of R716 388). The investment fair value reserve is currently stated at R638 326 (2021 - R716 381).

During the year, the Firstrand preference shares were redeemed realising a profit of R5 659. Transfer to reserves

In the interests of prudence, your management committee proposes to transfer an amount of R50 000 from accumulated funds to the National Tournament Reserve, increasing it from R100 000 to R150 000 with effect from 31 December 2022.

Budget

A budget for the year ending 31 December 2023 is attached and reflects a proposed loss of R56 814 (2022 - audited loss R29 115). This loss is stated after budgeting of R25 500 for the estimated costs of the Presidents' dinner which the management committee has agreed to fund for all future tournaments.

TOURS

The Senior Golfer's Union of South Africa were invited to tour Australia in October 2022. A group of 10 Seniors and their spouses enjoyed a wonderful three week trip to Australia visiting Brisbane, Melbourne and Sydney. Twelve games were played and four spouses also enjoyed the golf. The courses played were in magnificent condition and the group were privileged to play on a number of world top 10 courses. The hospitality was excellent and the costs were very reasonable having regard to Australia having become a very expensive destination in Rand terms. The non-playing ladies were entertained very well throughout the tour.



The entries for the tour were unfortunately lower than expected in spite of repeated requests to the Societies for members to enter. One would think that the hangover from Covid and the current financial position of members had a big effect on the entries. The next outgoing tour will be to Chile in 2024 mid-march and further information will be forthcoming from SGUSA as soon as we receive the formal invitation and brief itinerary and budget from AGOSECH in Chile. This is expected in the next two months. All historical tour information as well as the tour schedule and brochures relating to past tours are available on the SGUSA website under the tours tab. We urge members to log into the SGUSA website, save their passwords and then get access to the various tabs that affect your Senior golf experience. The King Leopold tournament in Belgium as well as the annual Deauville Tournament in France were cancelled in 2022. We hope to receive invitations shortly for the 2023 event and will pass them on to Societies as soon as we receive them.

IT

No significant upgrades to our tournament system were introduced during the year and the system is operating satisfactorily.

NATIONAL TOURNAMENT

It was with some trepidation that Border were given and accepted the invitation, after a two year postponement due to Covid 19, to host the 81st SGUSA National Tournament. Rising to the many challenges, Tony Harraway and his Local Organising Committee put together a very memorable week enhanced by unseasonable, brilliant weather. Both Courses were presented in admirable condition and West Bank silenced all detractors with most participants commenting that it was in the best condition they had ever experienced. The advantage of having a functions venue within the host course property allowed golfers ease of access to night time functions and most B&Bs were a short drive away. The catering for both events was of a very high standard and augmented the participants overall experience. The positives taken from this event will be carried forward into the 82nd Nationals and, despite the spiralling travel and accommodation costs, Pretoria's inaugural hosting promises to be a memorable event.

CONCLUSION

Those seniors who have had the pleasure and privilege of participating in any of our outgoing tours will recall being constantly reminded of the very special international fraternity of like-minded golfers we are all part of. Ours is a great fraternity of which we can be justly proud. It deserves our enthusiastic and ongoing support to ensure that it thrives for the benefit of its current and future members. Bear this in mind when you contemplate participating in your Society's matches and events or in The Nationals and Tours and when the opportunity arises for you to introduce a suitable new member to your Society.

Finally, I must express my gratitude to each and every member of Mancom for the sterling work, much of it unseen and unrecognised, they have put in over the past year for the benefit and enjoyment of SGUSA, its constituent Societies and their members.
